

Appendix 1 - Disadvantaged Student Additional Funding Policy
2018-19

The pupil premium grant for 2018 – 19 is £147,720 **TO BE CONFIRMED** overall.

This grant is used to support students who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), are Ever6 and children who are looked after/have been looked after by the local authority (LAC).

The Pupil Premium policy contains details of the main areas the PPG allocation is targeted to, however the purpose of this appendix is to clarify additional provision which may be provided, dependent on an individual student's needs/PPG existing commitment.

- Students may receive one KS4 hoodie during Year 9, 10 or 11, i.e. either a subject hoodie or a leaver's hoodie.
- Students will have one compulsory GCSE trip/residential activity paid for/contributed to up to a value of £240, throughout their period at school.
- Students are not entitled to contributions towards non-compulsory trips (e.g. France Watersports, London Show trips)
- Students are entitled to receive GCSE revision guides and resources up to a total cost of £40 overall.
- The school may pay contributions to the East Riding Music Service for instrumental music lessons up to a cost of £240 a year but this may impact on contributions to other activities.
- The school may provide other learning resources, such as cooking ingredients for those students undertaking GCSE Food, if required.
- There is a bursary for ALL Year 11 DS students who wish to go on the National Citizenship Service.
- Other limited contributions may be considered dependent on an individual student's needs and existing commitment of their PPG.
- All forms/consent slips must be completed by parents/carers and returned to the school by given deadlines.

If a teacher feels a student should be in receipt of any of the above, a request for additional DS funding form should be completed and signed. It should then be returned to Lorraine Stephenson for approval. No commitment should be made to the student until the request has been approved.
